



Breast & Cervical Health Screening

You may qualify for a **FREE** and potentially life-saving health screening.



If you're a woman, you're at risk for breast and cervical cancer.

Every woman is at risk for breast and cervical cancer, and the risk gets greater as you get older.

The Idaho Department of Health and Welfare's Women's Health Check program offers **FREE** mammograms and Pap tests for women who qualify.

You may be eligible for screening if you are a U.S. citizen or eligible and meet these three criteria:

- 1 You are 50-64 years old** — a free Pap test, pelvic exam, clinical breast exam, and mammogram.
You are 40-49 years old — a free Pap test and pelvic exam.
- 2 You have no health insurance coverage for Pap tests or mammograms** — this includes Medicaid.
- 3 Your gross monthly income is less than 200% of the Federal Poverty Level.***
 - **Less than \$1,805 monthly** for one (1) person
 - **Less than \$2,428 monthly** for two (2) people
 - **Add \$623 monthly for each additional person** in the household

Most Pap test and mammogram results are normal. The tests themselves are private, quick, simple, and cause minimal discomfort. The peace of mind that screening can provide you is priceless.

Detecting breast or cervical cancer early increases the chance for successful treatment and dramatically increases chances for a complete cure. Most women with no health insurance may be eligible for treatment through Medicaid.
