- By 2020, more than 60% of Idaho jobs will require a career certificate or college degree.
- Roughly 90% of Treasure Valley students graduated from high school in 2009.
- Half of these graduates went on to college within a year of graduating.
- Based on historic data, we can anticipate that a quarter of these graduates will have attained a degree within 6 years.

6. Is supported through meaningful career progression.


