
IDAHO INFANT TODDLER PROGRAM GUIDE TO ICF/ID LEVEL OF CARE RECOMMENDATION

This tool can be used as a guide to help determine if a child should be recommended for Intermediate Care Facilities for Persons with Intellectual Disabilities (ICF/ID) Level of Care determination review by the Idaho Center for Disabilities Evaluation (ICDE).

Persons determined eligible for ICF/ID level of care must:

- 1) Have a developmental disability, and
- 2) Meet one of the four criteria (functional, behavioral, functional/behavioral, or medical), and
- 3) Require active treatment.

Step 1.

Does the child have a developmental disability, as defined in the “Infant Toddler Program Eligibility/ Developmental Disabilities Determination Checklist?”

Step 2.

Does the child meet one of the following four criteria?

1. Functional

Child has an age equivalency composite score on the SIB-R of less than 50% of their chronological age.

2. Behavioral

- a. Child has a SIB-R maladaptive behavioral score of -22 or less.
- b. Child has a SIB-R maladaptive score above -22, they seriously endanger the safety of themselves or others, the behavior is directly related to the developmental disability, and they required active treatment to control or decrease the behavior.

3. Functional/Behavioral

Child has an age equivalency composite score between 50% and 53% of their chronological age in combination with a -17 to -22 on the SIB-R.

4. Medical

The child’s medical condition significantly affects the individual’s functional level/capabilities. Indicated by the “Supplemental Medical Assessment for ICF/ID Level of Care.” (This form will be completed by ICDE staff.)

Step 3.

Does the child require a range of professional services and the supports and resources of a comprehensive and specially designed program which is consistently and aggressively implemented in order to make progress or maintain current functional level? Indicated by the “Active Treatment Checklist.” (This form will be completed by ICDE staff.)
