## Family Centered Early Intervention Through Home Visits

Assisting parents as they explore:

- ◆ Implications of hearing loss on family communication
- ◆ Communication opportunities
- ◆ Building family relationships and a home environment to promote and stimulate early learning and language development
- ◆ Networking with other parents and professionals
- ◆ Pediatric loaner hearing aids
- ◆ Educational audiology services, including hearing aid use, maintenance, and management
- ◆ Cochlear implant option
- ◆ Language and speech development
- ◆ Auditory development
- ◆ Goals for literacy
- ◆ Current literature and information
- ◆ Family education workshops and activities
- ◆ Educational assessments including language development, auditory skills, sign language development

### Who Qualifies:

Any child birth to 3 with a permanent hearing loss who resides in the state of Idaho.

### Educational Centers:

Seven Educational Centers provide early intervention and consultative services to each community statewide.

### Cost:

IESDB Outreach services are free of charge for families with children with diagnosed hearing loss.

### Referrals:

Inquiries from parents are always welcomed. Referrals may also come from audiologists, physicians, educators, and/or other personal or professional stakeholders.
