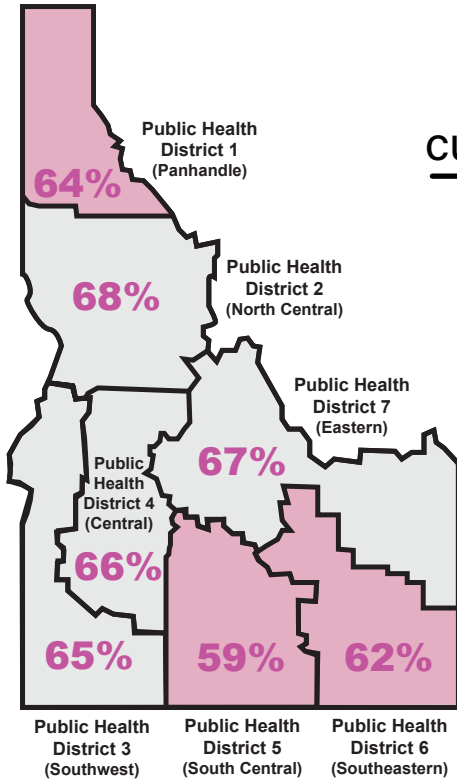
of new cases of invasive breast cancer were diagnosed at a **late stage** in 2017

## Screening 2016

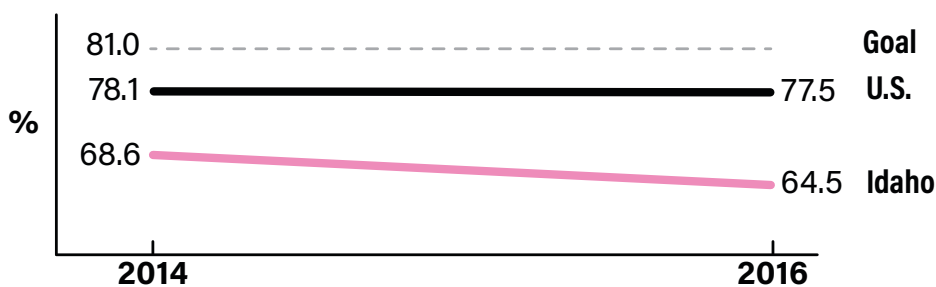


Women that are current on screening.

**Idaho 65%** | **U.S. 78%**

Public Health Districts 1, 5 and 6 have a lower screening rate than the state overall.

## Screening Guidelines

Mammograms starting no later than age 50 and at least every 2 years up to age 74.

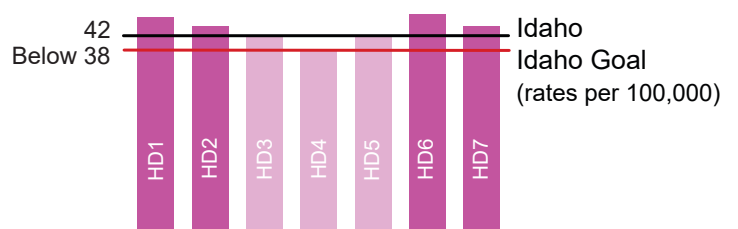
## Priority Populations

Greatest impact on screening rates can be made by focusing on:

- Women age 50-64
- Women with health insurance
- Hispanic and American Indian/Alaska Native women

Late stage diagnosis are more frequent among women who are rarely or never screened for breast cancer.

## Late Stage Incidence 2016



Public Health Districts 1, 2, 6, and 7 have higher incidence rates of late stage breast cancer than the state overall.
