

HIV IS NOT A CRIME (Or is it?)

Join us to learn more about HIV criminalization, how it affects people with HIV, HIV testing and disclosure, and HIV prevention efforts.

Sean Strub, founder of POZ Magazine and executive director of The SERO Project, combating HIV criminalization, will show his short film, HIV IS NOT A CRIME, featuring three people who have been prosecuted for non-disclosure of their HIV status prior to intimate contact with a partner.

- *Nick Rhoades had an undetectable viral load and used a condom; he got 25 years in prison and lifetime sex offender registration in Iowa;*
- *Monique Moree told her partner to use a condom, but he declined, she was prosecuted by the Army and discharged;*
- *Robert Suttle was in a contentious relationship, when they broke up, his partner went to the police and filed charges against Robert for not having initially disclosed his HIV status to the partner.*

In NONE of these cases was HIV transmitted. How does HIV criminalization affect HIV prevention? Are these statutes preventing or facilitating the spread of HIV?
