




Respondents per Health District (75 total)




Overall Average Worksite Score as % of Maximum




Average Worksite Subscores as % of Maximum











Average Respondents per Area




Results by Employer Size


Overall Average Score by Employer Size




Overall Average Score by Employer Size & Health District



Org. Supports - Average Subscore by Employer Size and Health District




Tobacco Control - Average Subscore by Employer Size and Health District














Full-time vs. Part-time Employees




Salaried vs. Hourly Employees




Age of Employees




Gender of Employees
