

## List of Qualified Industrial Hygienists Serving Idaho

According to the Clandestine Drug Laboratory Cleanup Rules (IDAPA 16.02.24), after a drug lab is cleaned, clearance sampling must be conducted by a qualified industrial hygienist to verify the cleanup standard has been met. A qualified industrial hygienist must be one of the following:

- a. Certified Industrial Hygienist. An individual who is certified in comprehensive practice by the American Board of Industrial Hygiene (ABIH).
- b. Registered Professional Industrial Hygienist™. An individual who is a registered member of the Association of Professional Industrial Hygienists (APIH) and possesses a baccalaureate degree, issued by an accredited college or university, in industrial hygiene, engineering, chemistry, physics, biology, medicine, or related physical and biological sciences who has a minimum of three (3) years full-time industrial hygiene experience. A completed master's degree in a related physical or biological science, or in a related engineering discipline, may be substituted for one (1) year of the experience requirement; and a similar doctoral degree may be substituted for an additional year of the experience requirement.
