

- Protect employers from coverage penalties


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More Reasons...

- A new report says **Idaho will lose \$3.3 billion in federal Medicaid funds**, and \$1.5 billion for hospital reimbursement, over roughly the next decade by not expanding its Medicaid program to all poor adults.
 - *Idaho Statesman, Aug. 2014*
- "If the 23 states that have rejected expanding Medicaid under the 2010 health care law continue to do so for the next eight years, they'll pay \$152 billion **(\$1.24 B for Idaho) to extend the program in other states** – while receiving nothing in return."
