

NATALITY

U.S.

The U.S. recorded 3,952,841 live births in 2012¹, which was relatively no change from 3,953,590 live births in 2011. The 2012 birth rate was 12.6 per 1,000 population, compared with 12.7 per 1,000 population in 2011. The 2012 general fertility rate of 63.0 births per 1,000 women aged 15-44 was a historic low for the United States¹.

Idaho

Following decades of consistently higher birth and fertility rates, Idaho's birth rates fell considerably in the 1980's to converge with the U.S. rate in 1988 for the first time. After three years below the U.S. rate, Idaho's birth rate rose above the U.S. birth rate again from 1992 through 2011. In 2012, the birth rate for Idaho was 14.4, a 2.1 percent increase from 14.1 in 2011. The fertility rate decreased 2.2 percent from 75.7 in 2011 to 74.0 per 1,000 women aged 15-44 in 2012. The number of births increased by 630 births (2.8 percent), from 22,311 births in 2011 to 22,941 births in 2012.

Idaho live birth rates in 2012 ranged from a low of 11.6 per 1,000 population in District 1 to a high of 19.6 per 1,000 in District 7. Six districts experienced higher birth rates in 2012 from 2011, District 4 birth rate decreased. District 2 had the largest rate increase (9.3 percent) from 10.8 to 11.8; District 4 decreased 3.8 percent from 13.0 in 2011 to 12.5 in 2012.

Race and Ethnicity of Mother

Beginning in 2004, more than one race and ethnicity may be reported for the mother, and mother's race data were collapsed into six race categories: white, black, American Indian, Asian and Pacific Islander, other race, or race not stated. Ethnicity data were collapsed into Hispanic, non-Hispanic, or ethnicity not stated. In 2012, 89.9 percent of Idaho mothers were white, 0.9 percent were black, 1.9 percent were American Indian, 2.0 percent were Asian or Pacific Islander and 5.4 percent reported other race. A total of 15.3 percent of mothers were of Hispanic origin and 84.7 percent were non-Hispanic.

Race and Hispanic origin are reported separately on the certificate; mothers of Hispanic origin may be of any race. The method in which race data are categorized changed in 2004 with the use of the new birth certificate, and data in 2012 are not comparable with race data prior to 2004. In Idaho, if mother's race is reported as other race and "Hispanic" or "Mexican" is specified as the race, then mother's race remains coded to "other race". Not all states follow this method of coding mother's race. In some states, if mother's race is reported as "Hispanic" or "Mexican", the race is coded as white. Because not all states report race and ethnicity to the National Center for Health Statistics in the same manner, Idaho race data are not comparable with national data. See Technical Notes for more information.

Age of Mother

The mean age of all Idaho mothers was 27.3 years in 2012. For the 7,983 first-time mothers with known age, the mean age was 24.4 years in 2012, compared with 25.8 years for first-time mothers in the U.S. in 2012¹. The ages for first-time mothers ranged from 14 to 50 in Idaho in 2012. The majority of Idaho births, 59.2 percent, were to mothers aged 20 to 29 in 2012 compared with 59.4 percent in 2011. Teen mothers aged less than 20 accounted for 6.9 percent of births in 2012 compared with 7.2 percent of all live births in 2011. A total of 33.9 percent of mothers were aged 30 or older in 2012, compared with 33.4 percent in 2011.

Education of Mother

In 2004, education data collected on the birth certificate were revised to report the highest degree or level of school completed at the time of delivery. Prior to 2004, the number of years of school completed was reported on the Idaho birth certificate. In 2012, 13.1 percent of mothers were not high school graduates and 86.9 percent of mothers were high school graduates, had their GED or attained a higher level of education at the time of delivery. Of the Idaho mothers aged less than 18 years, 85.3 percent had not yet received their high school diploma. A total of 34.8 percent of mothers aged 18 and 19 had not received their diploma, and 10.5 percent of mothers aged 20 and older had not received their diploma at the time of delivery in 2012.

Birth Attendant

In 2012, 89.2 percent of births to Idaho residents were attended by physicians and 10.8 percent were non-physician attended. While the number of total births increased 2.1 percent from 2011 to 2012, the number of births attended by physicians increased 2.7 percent from 19,923 in 2011 to 20,462 in 2012. The number of births attended by certified nurse midwives increased 11.1 percent from 1,504 to 1,671; the number of births attended by licensed, other or lay midwives decreased 10.9 percent from 741 in 2011 to 660 in 2012.

The category "licensed midwife" was added to the Idaho birth certificate in May 2010. A lay midwife can become a licensed midwife in Idaho by meeting the requirements established by the Idaho Bureau of Occupational Licenses under the auspices of the State Board of Midwifery. Successful applicants are required to provide proof of certification as a Certified Professional Midwife and successful completion of board approved courses in pharmacology, the treatment of shock/IV therapy and suturing specific to midwives.

Place of Birth

A total of 3.5 percent (792) of Idaho's 2012 resident births occurred in a non-hospital setting. Most of the out-of-hospital births occurred at a residence (460 or 2.0 percent) or a freestanding birthing center (325 or 1.4 percent). In 2012, a total of 11 babies were born en route to a hospital.

Prenatal Care

The collection of prenatal care data changed dramatically with the revision of the Idaho birth certificate in 2004. Prenatal care data on the revised certificate are based on the date of the first prenatal care visit, the length of gestation, and the date of birth. Prior to 2004, prenatal care on the certificate was based on the month prenatal care began (first, second, third, etc. month of pregnancy). In 2012, 73.9 percent of births were to mothers with a first visit in the first trimester compared with 74.4 percent in 2011. A total of 20.6 percent of births were to mothers with their first visit in the second trimester, and 4.7 percent of births were to mothers with their first visit in the third trimester. Less than one percent of births were to mothers with no prenatal care visits in 2012.

Low Birthweight and Preterm Births

Nationally, 8.0 percent of births were low birthweight (< 2,500 grams or 5 lb. 8 oz.) in 2012¹, which down slightly from 2011 (8.1 percent). Among Idaho residents, the percent of low birthweight live births increased from 6.1 percent in 2011 to 6.5 percent in 2012. U.S. data in 2012 indicate 11.6 percent of live births were preterm (less than 37 completed weeks of gestation)¹. The percent of preterm infants was 10.3 percent in Idaho in 2012, up from 10.1 percent in 2011. There is a

correlation between low birthweight babies and preterm births. Of the 2,352 babies born preterm (prior to 37 weeks gestation), 989 (42.1 percent) were born low birthweight compared with 2.4 percent born low birthweight among babies born to term (37 to 41 weeks gestation).

The highest percentage of low birthweight infants were born to District 5 mothers (7.4 percent) and District 6 mothers (7.2 percent). Mothers in Districts 6 (11.0 percent), 4 and 3 (both 10.9 percent) had the highest percentage of preterm births.

Plurality

In 2012, there were 22,224 singletons, 680 twins and 36 triplets or higher-order births. The percent of low birthweight infants was 4.9 percent for singletons, 53.8 for twins, and 100.0 percent for triplets or higher-order births in 2012. The Idaho preterm rate was 8.5 percent for singletons, 61.3 percent for twins, and 100.0 percent for triplets or higher-order births in 2012.

WIC (Supplemental Nutritional Program for Women, Infants, and Children)

In 2012, 42.9 percent of live births were to mothers who received WIC food for themselves during pregnancy, compared with 44.2 percent of births in 2011. Over half of the live births in District 3 (52.8 percent) were to mothers who participated in WIC. Mothers aged less than 20 were nearly twice as likely to receive WIC food (78.2 percent) than mothers aged 20 and older (40.3 percent). Unmarried mothers were twice as likely to receive WIC food (70.4 percent) than married mothers (32.6 percent).

Breastfeeding

A total of 91.2 percent of Idaho infants were breastfed at birth in 2012. Mothers aged less than 20 were less likely to have breastfed at the time of birth (85.9 percent) than mothers aged 20 and older (91.6 percent). Fewer unmarried mothers breastfed at birth (85.8 percent) than married mothers (93.3 percent).

Out of Wedlock

In Idaho, the total number of births increased 2.1 percent from 2011 to 2012, while the number of out-of-wedlock births increased 6.3 percent from 5,898 in 2011 to 6,267 in 2012. The percent of out-of-wedlock Idaho births increased from 26.4 percent in 2011 to 27.3 percent in 2012. In Idaho, the percentage of births to unmarried mothers ranged from 16.1 percent among Asian or Pacific Islander mothers and 66.4 percent among American Indian or Alaska Native mothers. Nationally in 2012 and 2011, 40.7 percent of all births were to unmarried women¹.

Risk Factors

The section on the Idaho birth certificate for maternal risk factors was revised in 2004. A total of 6,437 births (28.1 percent) were to Idaho mothers with at least one risk factor during pregnancy. The most common risk factor to mothers was previous cesarean delivery (2,993) followed by hypertension (1,957 total, 262 with prepregnancy hypertension and 1,695 with gestational hypertension), and diabetes (1,143 total, 142 with prepregnancy diabetes, and 1,001 with gestational diabetes).

Infections

There are 12 infections listed on the Idaho birth certificate, plus a category for “other” infections present and/or treated during this pregnancy. The most common infection reported was group B streptococcus; 4,299 or 18.7 percent of births were to mothers with or treated for group B streptococcus. Among births with known data for infection status, 5,072 (23.1 percent) births were to mothers with at least one infection present and/or treated during pregnancy in 2012.

Maternal Morbidity (Complications)

Maternal morbidity is defined on the Idaho birth certificate as complications associated with labor and delivery. A total of 1.7 percent of Idaho births (398) were to mothers with one or more complications of labor and delivery reported on the birth certificate in 2012. The leading complications reported were: third or fourth degree perineal laceration (245 births), maternal transfusion (90 births), and unplanned operating room procedure following delivery (70 births).

Characteristics of Labor and Delivery

The most common characteristics of labor and delivery reported in 2012 were: epidural or spinal anesthesia during labor (17,036 births or 74.3 percent), antibiotics received by mother during labor (6,240 or 27.2 percent), induction of labor (6,197 births or 27.0 percent), and augmentation of labor (5,815 births or 25.4 percent).

Abnormal Conditions of the Newborn

One in eight newborns had at least one abnormal condition reported on the 2012 birth certificate (2,992 or 13.1 percent). The most common abnormal condition reported was Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU) admission (2,314), followed by assisted ventilation required immediately following delivery (748) and newborn received antibiotics for suspected neonatal sepsis (702).

Congenital Anomalies of the Newborn

A total of 181 Idaho newborns had one or more congenital anomalies in 2012. Cleft lip and cleft palate was reported for 36 births. Suspected other chromosomal disorders was reported for 35 births (11 had confirmed karyotype disorders), 15 births reported down syndrome (2 had karyotype confirmed), 33 births reported cyanotic congenital heart disease, and 35 births reported Hypospadias.

Cigarette Smoking

Among birth with reported data on cigarette smoking, 14.4 percent of mothers reported smoking the three months prior to pregnancy; 10.2 percent reported smoking during the first three months of pregnancy; 8.5 percent reported smoking during the second three months of pregnancy; and 8.0 percent reported smoking during the third three months of pregnancy. Overall, 2,398 (10.5 percent) live births were to Idaho mothers who reported smoking any time during pregnancy. The percentage of mothers who reported smoking any time during pregnancy ranged from a low of 7.0 percent in District 7 to a high of 16.6 percent in District 2.

By age group, teens aged 18-19 had the highest percentage of mothers who smoked during pregnancy (19.7 percent), and mothers aged 45 and older had the lowest percentage of mothers who smoked (3.7 percent). By race, American Indian or Alaskan natives had the highest percentage of mothers who smoked (17.4 percent), and mothers of “other race” had the lowest percentage of

mothers who smoked (2.6 percent). Non-Hispanic mothers were 2.6 times more likely to smoke during pregnancy (11.6 percent) than Hispanic mothers (4.4 percent) in 2012.

In 2012, 6.5 percent of all live births were low birthweight. Of the 2,398 births to women who smoked during pregnancy, 261 (10.9 percent) infants were low birthweight compared with 5.9 percent of babies born to nonsmokers.

Method of Delivery

In 2012, the Idaho resident birth rate for vaginal, non-VBAC (vaginal deliveries after a cesarean) births was 72.7 deliveries per 100 births; the total birth rate for vaginal deliveries was 75.1 per 100 births compared with 67.2 per 100 births nationally in 2012. Conversely, Idaho's total cesarean rate (24.9 deliveries per 100 births) in 2012 was lower than the national rate of 32.8 per 100 births in 2012¹. Rates for VBACs and repeat cesareans are based on mothers with a previous cesarean. Idaho's VBAC rate was 18.0 deliveries per 100 births to women with previous cesarean, and the repeat cesarean rate for Idaho was 82.0 per 100 births to women with a previous cesarean.

Payment Source for Delivery

In 2012, 48.6 percent of deliveries were paid by private insurance in Idaho compared with 48.0 percent in 2011. In 2012, 39.0 percent of births were paid by Medicaid compared with 39.3 percent in 2011. A total of 7.6 percent of births were reported as self-pay, and a total of 3.5 percent of births were paid by other governmental agencies. A total of 1.3 percent of births had "other" payment source or did not have any payment source reported for the delivery. The payment source for delivery may change after the birth certificate is filed with the state.

Body Mass Index


Pre-pregnancy Body Mass Index (BMI) is a measure of weight and height before the woman became pregnant (see Technical Notes for classifications). In 2012, 11,263 (49.3 percent) births were to mothers classified as normal weight while 5,663 (24.8 percent) births were to women who were classified as being overweight and 5,172 (22.6 percent) births were to mothers who were obese.

Teen Pregnancy


Reportable pregnancies include live births, abortions, and stillbirths. Miscarriages under 20 weeks are not reported in Idaho. In 2012, there were 1,908 reportable pregnancies among Idaho females under the age of 20 (1,576 live births, 322 abortions, and 10 stillbirths). During the past decade there has been a steady decline in the annual teen pregnancy number (from 2,411 in 2002 to 1,891 in 2012) and rate (from 45.3 per 1,000 in 2002 to 34.1 per 1,000 in 2012) among Idahoans aged 15 to 19. The pregnancy rate for females aged less than 15 decreased 25 percent from 0.4 per 1,000 in 2011 to 0.3 in 2012, while the pregnancy rate for teens aged 15-17 years increased 1.4 percent from 14.6 to 14.8 per 1,000. At the same time, the pregnancy rate for females aged 18-19 increased 5.1 percent from 60.5 per 1,000 to 63.6 per 1,000.

PRENATAL CARE

The effects of prenatal care are difficult to quantify, but appropriate care can promote healthier pregnancies by detecting and managing pre-existing medical conditions and providing health behavior advice¹. The measurement of prenatal care in the U.S. and Idaho changed dramatically with the implementation of the 2003 U.S. Standard Certificate. Prenatal care data on the revised certificate are based on the date of the first prenatal care visit and the date of the last menstrual period (LMP). If LMP date is not stated, the date of first prenatal care visit, the clinical length of gestation and the baby's birth date are used to estimate the onset of prenatal care. According to the National Center for Health Statistics (NCHS), the change in data collection yields more accurate data because care is based on a date in a prenatal medical record rather than mother's recollection of the month of first visit². Prenatal care data based on the 2003 revision and the previous standard (1989 U.S. Standard Certificate) are not directly comparable.

For data year 2010, NCHS published prenatal care based on the 33 states using the 2003 U.S. Standard Certificate, including Idaho, and published prenatal care based on the remaining states using the 1989 U.S. Standard Certificate. Data for states that revise mid-year are excluded from U.S. statistics. Much if not all of the difference between states using the 2003 U.S. Standard Certificate and states using the 1989 U.S. Standard Certificate is related to changes in reporting and *not* to changes in the timing or utilization of prenatal care¹.

One measure of prenatal care in which classifications of the adequacy of prenatal care are based on the onset of prenatal care, the number of prenatal visits, and the length of gestation is the Adequacy of Prenatal Care Utilization (APNCU) Index. The APNCU Index is based on full recommendations set forth by the American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists (ACOG). This index classifies care as intensive, adequate, intermediate, inadequate, or no care by comparing the number of actual prenatal care visits to the number of visits that a woman was expected to receive, given the onset of prenatal care and the length of gestation.

In reviewing Trimester of First Prenatal Care Visit and APNCU data, keep in mind:

- 1) Prenatal care data based on date of first visit are not comparable with prenatal care data based on month prenatal care began. There is a break in the Idaho trend line between 2003 and 2004.
- 2) Not all states have revised their birth certificate to the 2003 U.S. Standard Certificate. Idaho resident births occurring in states with non-revised certificates will not have comparable data for onset of prenatal care. Data are shown as not stated in data table(s).

OUT-OF-WEDLOCK BIRTHS

The number of out-of-wedlock births increased each year from 1998 to 2008, decreased from 2008 to 2009, increased from 2009 to 2010, and decreased from 2010 to 2011. The number of out-of-wedlock births increased 369 (6.3 percent) from 5,898 in 2011 to 6,267 in 2012. Because the total number of births increased at a slower rate than the number of out-of-wedlock births, the percentage of total live births that were out-of-wedlock births increased 3.4 percent from 2011 to 2012.

The 2012 out-of-wedlock percentages increased for White, American Indian/Alaska Natives, Asian/Pacific Islanders, and Hispanics, and decreased for blacks, and women of “other race”. Note, Idaho has relatively small numbers for non-white rates; some fluctuation from year to year can be expected.

The percent of all U.S. out-of-wedlock births stayed the same at 40.7 percent in 2011 and 2012. By race, U.S. 2012 out-of-wedlock percent for whites was 40.8 percent higher than Idaho’s percent, and the U.S. black percent was 79.9 percent higher than Idaho’s percent. The U.S. 2012 Hispanic percent was 18.9 percent higher than Idaho’s percent in 2012.


From 2011 to 2012, the percentage of out-of-wedlock births increased in Health Districts 1, 2, 3, 4, and 5, and decreased in districts 6 and 7. District 3 recorded the highest proportion of live births that were out of wedlock (34.8 percent) followed by District 1 (34.2 percent). District 7 recorded the lowest percent of out-of-wedlock births again in 2012 (16.5 percent).

Counties with the highest percentages of out-of-wedlock births were Benewah (52.0 percent) Clearwater (49.3 percent), and Nez Perce (45.2 percent). The lowest percentages occurred in Madison (3.4 percent), Bear Lake (11.1 percent), and Franklin (14.1 percent) counties.




TEEN FERTILITY RATES BY AGE U.S. and Idaho (Total and White) 2012




TEEN OUT-OF-WEDLOCK BIRTH PERCENTS BY AGE U.S. and Idaho (Total and White) 2012
