Early **detection** is the key to breast cancer survival.

Idaho Goal: 81% screening rate by 2020


Idaho ranks **50th** in the nation for screening

35% of new cases of invasive breast cancer were diagnosed at a **late stage** in 2013

191 deaths from breast cancer in 2014

82% of Idaho women will **survive** at least 5 years after diagnosis

Screening 2014

Public Health Districts **1, 3, 5, 6** and **7** have lower screening rates than the state overall

Screening Guidelines

Mammograms starting no later than age 50 and at least every 2 years, up to age 74.


Women's Health Check provides breast and cervical screening for low-income, uninsured women.


Take Action

Late Stage Incidence 2013

Public Health District 1, 2, 4 and 5 have higher incidence rates of late stage breast cancer than the state overall.



Mortality 2014

Public Health District 1, 2, 3 and 5 have higher death rate from breast cancer than the state overall.
