## What should I bring to the practical exam?

You must bring:

- **Government Issued Picture ID, such as a Driver's License.**


You may bring:

- Your personal equipment (Blood pressure cuff, Stethoscope). However, it must be approved by the On-Site Exam Administrator to be used during the exam process.
- Your exam study books and notes for review during waiting periods between exam stations.
- Something to eat or drink during the exam. Your exam location may not have food or beverage facilities nearby.



## What will my practical exam experience be like?

- It is important to give yourself some time before the exam to relax and orient yourself to the exam surroundings. Try to arrive a few minutes early to allow for personal organization and exam formalities.
- The exam may take up to eight (8) hours to complete: Exam length depends on the number of candidates participating in the exam and may require more or less time. Please make allowances for this when scheduling your time.
- Wear comfortable clothing suitable for performing skills in simulated field conditions.

- This is a practical exam so there can be no discussion of exam stations or station skills during waiting periods. You may review your exam study materials, but please refrain from open discussion about the exam. It is distracting to others who are in the staging area and may result in your dismissal from the exam.



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
