Contracts signed and dated by both parties for all contracted services	
Governing Body and Medical Staff bylaws	
Table of organization – Please include the number and type of personnel, also.	
Description of laboratory tests and radiology services to be provided on-site and those to be provided via contract and the turnaround times for these	
Job descriptions	
Staff training program to include both orientation and continuing staff training and proficiency testing for patient care staff
