




Percent of Total Land Ownership

Minidoka County is located in south-central Idaho, along the Snake River Plain. It ranks 18th among Idaho counties in population and 35th in area. The federal government owns nearly 36 percent of the county. Agriculture, food processing and trade are the major economic activities, and government also provides significant employment. Annual average total civilian employment decreased 1.4 percent from 1996 to 2006. Major employers include the Minidoka County School District, Minidoka County government, City of Rupert, Minidoka Memorial Hospital, Amalgamated Sugar, Magic Valley Foods, Brewster Cheese, Gossner Foods and Burley Inn, Inc.

The construction of the Minidoka Dam by the Bureau of Reclamation stimulated creation of thousands of acres of irrigated farmland. The dam, completed in 1906, powered the first hydroelectric generator in the Northwest. Much of the northern region of the county remains arid desert land covered with interesting formations of lava flows. Lake Walcott Park and Minidoka National Wildlife Refuge offer superb recreational opportunities.




Level and Type of EMS Courses 2005-2007










Collision History 2004-2006

(gravel is considered improved)







EMS Agency Licensure Levels




EMS Agency Structure






EMS Agency Classification




EMS Agency Structure Transport/Non-Transport



EMS Agency Staff Mix 2007-2008



Historic EMS Manpower Complement 2000-2008












All Transport and Non-Transport Agency PCR Submissions




### Dedicated Fund Vehicle Grants
