





Twin Falls County is located in southern Idaho, bordering Nevada. It ranks 6th among Idaho counties in population and 13th in area. The federal government owns 52 percent of the county. Agriculture, food processing and manufacturing dominate the local economy, with trade, services, manufacturing and government rounding out the employment picture. Annual average total civilian employment grew 27.2 percent from 1996 to 2006. Major employers are Lamb Weston-ConAgra, College of Southern Idaho, St. Luke's Magic Valley Regional Medical Center, Twin Falls County government, Twin Falls School District, City of Twin Falls, Amalgamated Sugar, Seastrom Manufacturing, Solo Cup Company, Dell Computers, Jayco, Inc., Clear Springs Foods, Rangen, Inc., Seneca, Longview Fibre and Independent Meats.


The Snake River Canyon on the northern edge of the county offers spectacular scenery. Roaring waterfalls on the canyon cliffs highlight the Thousand Springs Scenic Route. The abundant fresh water supports trout farms that produce most of the nation's commercial trout. Shoshone Falls, known as the "Niagara of the West", on the Snake River, is 212 feet high and is 52 feet higher than Niagara Falls. Another scenic attraction is Balanced Rock, near Castleford.



Presence of a Post-secondary Educational Institution and the EMS Program Within the Institution




Level and Type of EMS Courses 2005-2007






Poison Control Calls for CY2006






Collision History 2004-2006

(gravel is considered improved)







EMS Agency Licensure Levels




EMS Agency Structure






EMS Agency Classification




EMS Agency Structure Transport/ Non-Transport



EMS Agency Staff Mix 2007-2008



Historic EMS Manpower Complement 2000-2008












All Transport and Non-Transport Agency PCR Submissions




Dedicated Fund Vehicle Grants

Number of Requests, Awards and Dollar Amount of Vehicle Grants Awarded




Dedicated Fund Equipment Grants
