



ATR 4 Funding for Veterans with SUD

The Division of Behavioral Health has been awarded an Access to Recovery (ATR 4) grant scheduled to be available in early 2015 for Veterans. ATR 4 is a three year grant that will provide approximately \$2.2 million per year for treatment and recovery support services across multiple populations, including Veterans with a Substance Use Disorder (SUD).

To access ATR 4, Veterans Treatment Court Coordinators, Felony Parole/Probations Officers, and Misdemeanant Probation Officers will refer clients to Business Psychology Associates (BPA) using the Funding Profile Form. Eligibility will be determined based on the following criteria:

- Income less than 200% of the Federal Poverty Rate in the past 30 days
- Assessment shows client meets clinical eligibility
- Veterans* with SUD on supervised probation and are involved in a problem solving court

Services available under ATR 4 include:

- Outpatient services including individual, group, and family counseling
- Adult Social Detox
- Case Management
- Safe and Sober Housing
- Drug Testing
- Transportation for treatment services
- Life Skills
- Recovery Coach

Year 1	360	\$769,015
Year 2	475	\$805,087
Year 3	400	\$786,776
Total	1,235	\$2,360,878

On average, ATR 4 clients are expected to receive services for 3-4 months. The average cost per client is projected at \$1,900.
