This training is for individuals who meet the standards to provide Clinical Supervision to QPs and QP Trainees. **Please Note:** Attendance of the training does not qualify you as a Clinical Supervisor.

Clinical Supervision Standards

#1-Applicant must hold a Master's Degree from an accredited , approved and recognized college or university in Health and Human Services or related fields and 5 years paid full time professional experience in a State approved alcohol/drug treatment program and 2 years paid full time experience in supervision in a State approved alcohol and drug treatment program. Experience in a "State approved" alcohol and drug treatment program is defined as experience in a program approved by the applicable state in which the program is/was located.

AND

#2-Applicant must be certified as an Advanced Certified Alcohol/Drug Counselor (ACADC) or Certified Clinical Supervisor (CCS) or nationally recognized equivalent (MAC, NCAC II) or current Master's level licensure.

AND

#3-Training must include formal or didactic education (college credits, CEUs) on Assessment/Evaluation, Counselor Development, Management/Administration and Professional responsibilities. The training/education should be reflective of the 12 core functions in their clinical applications and practice, with a minimum of ten (10) hours each in the 12 core functions.

AND

#4-Must have completed Northwest Frontier Addiction Technology Transfer Center (NFATTC) Clinical Supervision Level 1 training at the time of hire or within 6 months of hire date.

Please attach documentation that you meet or exceed the minimum requirements to be a Clinical Supervisor. Please include all of the following as well:

- Resume
- Diploma
- Licenses/Certifications
- Documentation of hours providing substance use disorders services, from direct supervisor
- Documentation of hours providing supervision to Qualified Professionals and/or Trainees, from direct supervisor.
