Deputy Keil is a certified Drug Recognition Expert Instructor. Joe has trained thousands across the United States in physiology and drug recognition. Keil currently instructs various drug courses for the Multijurisdictional Counter Drug Task Force for St. Petersburg College.

In 2009, Joe authored and published his first book "When Just Say No Doesn't Work". In this book Joe broke down the street level approach and identifiers of youth and adult drug users. This book has helped communities identify many of the signs and symptoms of drug use.

Joe currently holds a certification as an instructor in Standardized Field Sobriety Testing, Drug Recognition Expert, Drug Interdiction, Vehicle Contacts, Cultural Diversity and Ethics.

This will be Joe's 4th time providing training in the state of Idaho.

Officer Jermaine Galloway (Boise, Idaho)

Officer Galloway has been providing training for the last 8 years. Galloway has been a Boise Police Officer for the last 14 years, and is an Idaho POST certified instructor. Galloway currently provides training to police officers, prevention personnel, counselors, educators, parents and community coalition members. Galloway also spends much of his time speaking to youth on the harms of underage drinking, drug abuse and tobacco. Officer Galloway spends a lot of time researching, "scouting", learning information in regards to local Idaho (and national) establishments in regards to what they sell, market and promote. This unparalleled research will help you to identify what is being sold, used and abused in your community.

In 2009, Jermaine received the National Law Enforcement Partner of the year award from (OJJDP) Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention. In 2010, Jermaine received the National Mickey Sadaoff Underage Drinking Award from the director (MADD) Mothers Against Drunk Driving.
