



SOAR is a program designed to increase access to SSI/SSDI for eligible adults who are experiencing or at risk of homelessness and have a mental illness, medical impairment, and/or a co-occurring substance use disorder.



## Training

Trainees will have the opportunity to complete the online training with a cohort that will break the course out over several weeks and provide regular calls to discuss the materials. People are also able to complete the training on their own. There will be several Idaho specific Fundamental trainings offered throughout the year. To become a recognized Idaho SOAR Case Manager, participants will need to attend this training.
