Course Objectives:

- Conduct STD Partner Management for interviews for Syphilis, Gonorrhea, and Chlamydia.

- Describe and utilize the STD Interview Format.
- Discuss key motivators to facilitate a discussion of sex partners.
- Describe the “coaching” process for client referral of sex partners.
- State steps necessary to facilitate a client-generated STD/HIV risk reduction plan.
- Describe key elements to safely managing common field investigation situations.
- State the role and methods of a field investigator in maintaining patient and partner confidentiality.
