STATE OF IDAHO DRINKING WATER LABORATORY CERTIFICATION PROGRAM

This chapter of rules was rewritten to conform to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency’s Manual for Certification of Laboratories Analyzing Drinking Water, Criteria and Procedures Quality Assurance, Fifth Edition (EPA 815-R-05-004) and to update fees. These rules provide laboratories and the Department a clear and accurate description of the criteria and processes

required for initiating, maintaining and revoking drinking water certification. Companion Docket No. 16-0213-1001 (Chapter Repeal).

This will amend rules for children attending Idaho schools to increase the number of children who are fully protected from preventable diseases. This amendment will add conditional admission clause, vaccines, and clarify exclusion of children from attendance.

Guardianship of residents living in a CFH was changed to clarify who could be a guardian of a resident.

This is a chapter rewrite for licensing and certification requirements currently under IDAPA 16.04.11 “Developmental Disabilities Agencies.” This chapter provides licensing and certification requirements and provider qualifications for developmental disability agencies. (Companion to Docket 16-0411-1001).

The Department’s Criminal History and Background Checks (CHC) rules are being amended to reference only the Department’s chapter of rules when an individual is required to have a criminal history and background check. The Departments list of disqualifying crimes and

unconditional denials that prevent a person from receiving a CHC clearance were updated to include those listed on the Nurse Aid and Child Protection Central Registries, and additional crimes.

CRIMINAL HISTORY AND BACKGROUND CHECKS

The Department is required to check the Idaho Child Protection Central Registry when requested by another state, when an individual who applies to become a foster parent or adoptive parent in another state resided in Idaho within the past five years. Because of budgetary constraints, the Department is adding a fee to cover the administrative costs that occur when these checks are provided.

CHILD AND FAMILY SERVICES

Docket No. 16-0601-1001 (Pending)

These rules are being amended to comply with the Department’s Title IV-E State Plan. These rules address Title IV-E relative guardianship assistance to provide for a permanent living situation with a relative for older children, and detail requirements of the Multiethnic Placement Act (MEPA). The Fostering Connections to Success and Increasing Adoptions Act of 2008 has changed eligibility for Title IV-E adoption assistance. Within the next eight years (2010-2018), those changes could greatly expand the number of adopted children eligible for adoption assistance subsidies. As a result, these rules clarify who is eligible to receive an adoption subsidy, so those children who are most in need will continue to be able to receive assistance.

STANDARDS FOR CHILD CARE LICENSING

Docket No. 16-0602-1001 (Pending)

These rules amend Daycare Licensing Standards to align with statute. Statutory changes were effective on January 1, 2010 and necessitate corresponding changes and clarification in this chapter of rules. These rules were published as temporary rules, in order to have rules effective on July 1, 2010. These rule changes provide requirements and clarification for areas related to daycare licensing that include: safety and health standards, licensure requirements, suspension, denial, and revocation of licenses. While amending these child care licensing rules for daycare standards, other updates were made for consistency in language, clarification, deletion of obsolete language and updating references. These amendments will help ensure standards and processes to better protect the health and safety of children in child care facilities licensed by the Department.

This docket updates rules to allow for a breath alcohol test to be performed on individuals being brought in for treatment in addition to the blood draw alcohol test. This docket also amends the Tuberculin skin testing requirements.

DIRECTORS REPORT

Funding Idaho Medicaid

Director Armstrong presented this PowerPoint report to JFAC in a prior meeting.

- ❖ Medicaid SFY 2010 caseload increased 9.4%, reaching an average monthly enrollment of 210,015 people.
- ❖ 74% of the caseload increase includes coverage for additional 13,277 children.
- ❖ Enhanced ARRA funding allowed for a Medicaid rescission of \$73.5 million in General Funds (GF) in SFY 2010.
- ❖ Medicaid carried over \$89.5 million in claims payments to SFY 2011 due to a budget shortfall of \$18.5 million in GF.
- ❖ Payments were delayed ranging from a minimum of three weeks for most providers, to up to three months for hospitals and nursing homes.

Director Armstrong stated that caseload growth and inflation are the 2 main areas causing the increase in needed funds.

The total Medicaid SFY 2012 budget request is for:

\$471.6 million in General Funds

\$170.6 million in State Dedicated Funds

\$1,260.3 million in Federal Funds

\$1,902.5 million Total Funds requested

In this budget request, 96.8% of all Medicaid dollars go out to Trustee and Benefit payments and a mere 1% is paid out for personnel. 2.2% is for operating costs, including the actual administration of the claims system for Medicaid.

The Director reported the Department continues to lose staff members to higher paying jobs throughout the state. Further cuts in personnel could result in lower service levels due to lack of knowledge in areas where more responsibilities are placed on employees.

Medicaid Management Information System (MMIS) Update

Director Armstrong reported that Molina's staff has more than doubled since the system has gone live. Nine of the 18 identified critical issues with the new system have been resolved. The remaining nine unresolved items have targeted completion dates.

Health and Welfare has held payment of approximately \$16 million for contracted services not complete. Payment will continue to be held until the Department is satisfied the system is stable and contracted services are complete.

Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) Update

In FY 2010, Idaho was ranked #1 in the nation for the growing need for Food Stamps. This is a 40.5% increase. The department's service productivity has improved more than six-fold since 2001. Accuracy and timeliness of cases (75% of cases are processed the same day they are received) are at all time highs and the cost per case has decreased by 50% since 2004.

RECOMMENDATIONS FROM NOMINATING COMMITTEE

The Nominating Committee recommended the Board officers remain the same for the upcoming year 2011.

Motion: Quane Kenyon moved to cast a unanimous vote to accept the Nominating Committees recommendation to have Richard Roberge continue as Chairman and Janet Penfold to continue as Vice Chairman of the Health and Welfare Board.

Deputy Attorney General (DAG) Peg Dougherty reported on the Nick Arambarri case heard in District Court which pertained to the consolidation of the Department's 7 Regional Director positions to 3. She commended DAG Mark Withers for his clear representation of the Department. The Court found that the Director had the clear statutory authority to abolish the regional director position and granted the Department's Summary Judgment Motion. Affidavits that were provided by the board members in support of Director Armstrong's recommendation to consolidate the Department's 7 Regional Director positions to 3 positions, helped to tip the scales in favor of the Department.

In the future when an issue requiring Board concurrence with an action is required, Peg recommended that the record reflect a motion and concurrence by the Board.




ADJOURNMENT


