CHARMING TOWN OF OROFINO

Summer and fall offer the finest Steelhead and Chinook salmon fishing and you' will have immediate access to the Clearwater National Forest. Enjoy scenic golf courses, historic trails, a variety of camping and hunting and a 53-mile reservoir right out your front door! If you are a winter sport enthusiast, there are over 1,200 miles of groomed snowmobile trails, cross country alpine skiing and of course, fishing.

Dworshak Reservoir: A 53-mile long lake created by Dworshak Dam, which is the largest straight axis dam in North America.

Clearwater River: Known for its Steelhead Trout returning from the sea, with some weighing over 25 lbs.

Clearwater National Forest: This slice of outdoor paradise offers year-round recreation, including snowshoeing, camping, hiking or just enjoying the scenery.
