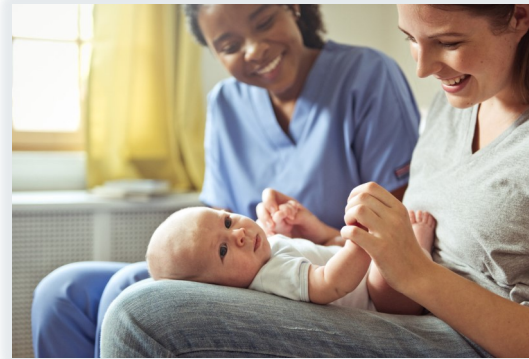

## EMPOWERING FAMILIES

Maternal, Infant, and Early Childhood Home Visiting (MIECHV) programs are free and voluntary to pregnant women and families caring for infants and young children. Participating families gain knowledge and skills to support their children's health and well-being, ensuring a great start to life.

Using MIECHV funding, local public health agencies provide home visiting services to twelve Idaho counties using two evidence-based programs, **Parents as Teachers** and **Nurse-Family Partnership**.



## PARENTS AS TEACHERS

### Service Population

Pregnant women and families with children from birth to 5 years old.

### Target Outcomes

1. Increase parent knowledge of early childhood development and improve parenting practices.
2. Provide early detection of developmental delays and health issues.
3. Prevent child abuse and neglect.
4. Increase children's school readiness and school success.

### Service Length

Families may enroll at any point, from pregnancy until the child is 5 years old. Parent educators offer 12-24 home visits annually depending on the needs of the family. Families are served for at least two years between pregnancy and kindergarten. Home visits typically last 60 minutes.

### Program Service Areas

Nez Perce, Clearwater, Ada, Twin Falls, Jerome, Power, Bannock, and Bonneville counties.

## NURSE - FAMILY PARTNERSHIP

### Service Population

First-time, low-income mothers and their babies.

### Target Outcomes

1. Improve prenatal health and outcomes.
2. Improve child health and development.
3. Improve families' economic self-sufficiency and maternal life course development.

### Service Length

Clients must receive a home visit by the woman's 29th week of pregnancy. Nurses conduct weekly home visits for the first month of enrollment, every other week until the baby is born, weekly for the first six weeks after birth, every other week until the baby is 20 months, and monthly until the child is 2 years old. Home visits typically last 60 minutes.

### Program Service Areas

Bonner, Kootenai, Shoshone, and Canyon counties.
