On **January 4, 2017**, an unannounced on-site complaint survey was conducted at Apex Center. The complaint was investigated in conjunction with the facility's on-site Recertification and State Licensure follow-up survey conducted January 3, 2017 through January 4, 2017.

The complaint allegations, findings and conclusions are as follows:

Complaint #ID00007437

ALLEGATION #1:

The Reporting Party said an identified resident developed a facility-acquired pressure ulcer and a deep tissue injury to the buttocks area during his/her stay at the facility.

FINDINGS:

Three residents were observed for pressure ulcer prevention interventions and no concerns were identified.

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The clinical record of the identified resident and three other residents' records were reviewed and no pressure ulcer concerns were identified. The facility's Incident and Accident reports for December 2016 and January 2017 were reviewed and no pressure ulcer concerns were identified.

Several staff members were interviewed regarding pressure ulcer prevention and they said residents received appropriate pressure ulcer prevention. Several staff members and the Director of Nursing Services said the identified resident did not develop pressure ulcers in the facility during the time in question.

The identified resident was no longer residing in the facility at the time the complaint was investigated.

Based on observation, record review and staff interview, it was determined the allegation could not be substantiated.

CONCLUSIONS:

Unsubstantiated. Lack of sufficient evidence.

As none of the allegations were substantiated, no response is necessary. Thank you for the courtesies and assistance extended to us during our visit.
