State-Funded respite care is on the rise in Idaho, in part to the creation of the Region 4 Respite Pilot Project and the beginning of contracted services. Those projects began in May-June 2016 —the beginning of the rise in services.

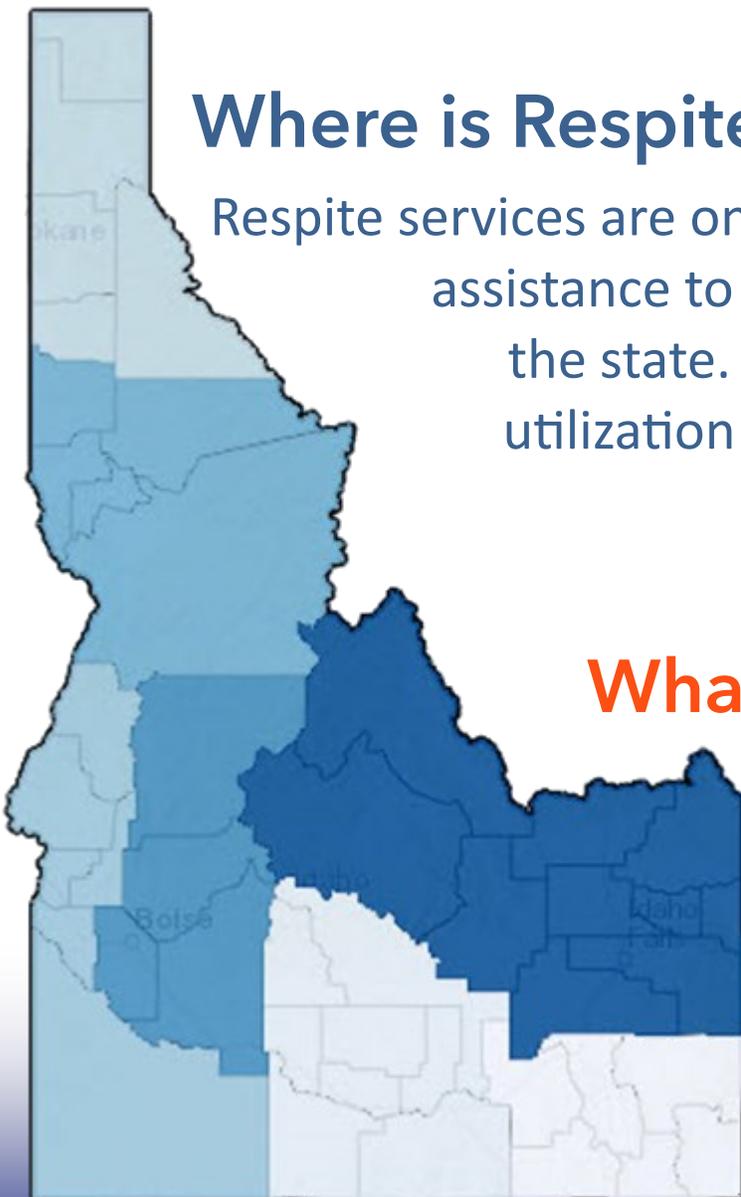
Where is Respite Care Most Utilized?

Respite services are on the rise state-wide, providing assistance to families in all seven regions of the state. Darker regions indicate higher utilization in the state, with lighter areas using fewer services.

What, *Exactly*, is Respite?

Respite care is short term voluntary planned or crisis care provided to families with children diagnosed with a serious emotional disturbance allowing temporary relief to the family caregiver.¹

From July 2015 to August 2016, DBH provided almost

700 respite care services, supporting over
140 individual children, providing
more than **\$145,000** in respite care for Idaho families.

Average cost per claim was calculated by dividing total spending in each region divided by total number of claims received.
