



Funding Opportunity Announcement

The Division of Behavioral Health (DBH) has been awarded the State Opioid Response (SOR) grant from SAMHSA. SOR Funding will be used to enhance the Idaho's Response to the Opioid Crisis (IROC) program. IROC provides Opiate Use Disorder (OUD) treatment and recovery support services, including Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT), to uninsured Idahoans with an OUD that have an income under 200% of the Federal Poverty Level (FPL) and who do not qualify for Medicaid.

Using SOR funding Idaho aims to bridge the gap in services currently occurring in Idaho throughout the state. To achieve this DBH will be dedicating SOR funds to work with OUD treatment providers to pilot new and innovative programs that will address gaps in services, meet the needs of Idaho's treatment and recovery support communities, and reduce the number of opioid related deaths within Idaho.

Funding is currently available by award for residential treatment providers within the BPA Health network. This funding opportunity is targeted toward the development and implementation of a longitudinal model of care starting with residential services. Applicants will need to assess their current resources as well as the gaps in services that result in a barrier to providing wraparound services and continuation of care. Applicants will need to submit a proposal outlining how they would develop and implement a successful longitudinal model of care if awarded funds.
