

The Idaho Department of Health and Welfare, Division of Behavioral Health (Department) is seeking proposals to provide PATH outreach, engagement, case management, and referral services for eligible adults statewide. PATH-eligible individuals are adults age 18 and older who have Serious Mental Illness (SMI) or co-occurring SMI and substance use disorders (SUD) and are experiencing homelessness or are at imminent risk of becoming homeless. PATH services shall include a preference for services to PATH-eligible veterans, individuals experiencing chronic homelessness, and individuals discharging from state psychiatric hospitals.

The expected deliverables under this subgrant are:

The funding amount for this opportunity is up to \$130,000 for a period of one (1) year. The Department anticipates awarding up to three (3), one (1)-year subgrants. One (1) subgrant is anticipated to be awarded for services within the Boise City/Ada County Continuum of Care and two (2) subgrants are anticipated to be awarded for services within the Idaho Balance of State Continuum of Care.

The source of PATH funds is a grant made available to states by the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) and SAMHSA. The PATH grant, Catalogue of Federal Domestic Assistance (CFDA) No. 93.150, is authorized via Section 521 et seq. of the Public Health Services (PHS) Act.

Applications will be evaluated based on how the prescribed activities fit the applicant organization's mission, the applicant's familiarity with and/or experience serving the target population, and the applicant's ability to fulfill the required activities within the allotted award amount.

Applicants will be required to provide their Data Universal Numbering System (DUNS) number and must affirm their understanding that no entity, as defined at 2 CFR Part 25, Subpart C, may receive award of a subgrant unless the entity has provided its DUNS number. 2 CFR 25.110. [An individual is exempt from this requirement.]

By applying, the applicant acknowledges that the entity shall comply with Single Audit requirements according to 2 CFR 200.500-521 (previously OMB A-133), subaward and executive compensation reporting requirements as required by the Federal Funding Accountability and Transparency Act (FFATA), and any specific grant requirements.
