Agenda Topics:

Welcome and Opening Remarks; Roll Call; Introductions; Review of Minutes; Action Items, and Agenda Review- *Dr. Ted Epperly, Co-Chair of the HTCI*

- ◆ Dr. Epperly welcomed everyone to the meeting and took roll call.
- ◆ Dr Epperly opened the meeting with a quote from James Herriot “If having a soul means being able to feel love loyalty and gratitude then animals are better off than a lot of humans.”

Payer/Provider Workgroup Planning Update- *Casey Moyer, OHPI*

- ◆ Casey Moyer updated the HTCI on the status of the Payer Provider Workgroup.
- ◆ Norm Varin and Dr. Kelly McGrath have been working on the charter and a recruitment strategy, with the first workgroup meeting focused on producing a charter to be shared with the HTCI in August.
 - The group will work on identifying the top ten spends in which collaboration could effectuate change.
 - Develop operational definitions for monitoring value-based payment reporting to support HTCIs goal.

Driver Metric Planning- *Casey Moyer, OHPI*

- ◆ Casey Moyer began the discussion by addressing the two previously identified drivers:
 - Finance: driving value-based payments in Idaho; and
 - Access: removing barriers the delivery system faces with improving quality healthcare.
- ◆ The Payer Provider Workgroup will be working on initiatives for value-based payments and a performance metric has been established for that driver.
- ◆ The access driver does not currently have a performance metric. The OHPI team has researched some options and identified primary care workforce as a potential measure. Baselineing and operationalizing the measurement of this metric could be done through a combination of Department of Labor analysis and nursing workforce analysis which were previously completed.
- ◆ OHPI has been working with the Department of Labor to potentially repeat the analysis annually as well as how to measure primary care physicians. Lisa Hettinger clarified that the purpose of a workforce metric in context of HTCI initiatives is needed to ensure the system changes being championed (e.g. payment reform) are not adversely impacting the workforce capacity. She categorized it as a “do no harm” backstop.
- ◆ HTCI member were encouraged to engage the OHPI team before the August meeting with ideas of alternate metrics and potential data sources to substantiate the measure.

Telehealth Initiative- *Dr. Tim Dunnagan & Dr. Ted Epperly*

- ◆ Dr. Tim Dunnagan and Dr. Epperly presented a request from the Health Quality Planning Commission (HQPC) asking for the HTCI to organize a telehealth task force needed to address the lack of adoption of Telehealth in Idaho. A task force structure would allow for a multi-disciplinary team to address the barriers of telehealth adoption in the current landscape and to advance specific recommendations to the HTCI and HQPC.

- ◆ Dr. Epperly proposed Jenni Gudapati co-chair this task force, given her experience and role with Boise State University.

Value-Based Healthcare Certificate Program- *Jenni Gudapati, Boise State College of Nursing*

- ◆ Jenni Gudapati provided background on a new certificate program Boise State anticipates offering in the coming year. The value-based healthcare certificate course is currently pending approval from the board of education and is based on the Dartmouth Institute's model.

Behavioral Health Integration Initiative- *Jen Yturriondobeitia, Cornerstone Whole Healthcare Organization*

- ◆ Jen Yturriondobeitia shared the work taking place on a behavioral health integration project administered by the Cornerstone Whole Healthcare Organization; the hub and spoke model serves as a capacity building platform to build off the existing Idaho Integrated Behavioral Health Network and is currently funded through a HRSA grant.
- ◆ Ms. Yturriondobeitia requested the HTCI's assistance with engaging payers to be a part of the of the demonstration project and assist in the development of a pilot value-based payment models.
- ◆ This initiative aligns well with value-based payment reform and behavioral health integration, referral to the Payer Provider Workgroup made upon passage of the action item.

- ◆ Dr. Epperly closed the meeting with thanking the members and guests for attending.







Desired Value Services - Overall


